Jay Sletson, the Executive Director of FPA, and Dr. Baker have both brought it to my attention that the State College Department of Ordinance Enforcement is cracking down on litter and refuse violations, especially during football weekends.

Last weekend, Code Enforcement officers issued \$800.00 in fines and several points to Fraternities. With the upcoming game against Akron, Code Enforcement officers are prepared to make random checks throughout the weekend to ensure that your properties are clean and sightly.

I advise the following:

1) If you plan on tailgating at your Fraternity prior to the football game, **clean up your property before you go to the game.** The "clean up by sun up" saying is not the law--it's a rule of thumb. Don't trash your property and come back from the game with a refuse violation.

Even clean-up services will not insulate you from potential points. The purpose of these services is not clean up thousands of cans--you cannot rely solely on these services to protect you!

2) Be responsible this weekend. While tailgating, be sure to take care of your property. Instead of throwing beer cans on the lawn, make trash cans available. It will make your lives much easier.

Encourage your members to have fun, but be responsible. There's nothing worse than an underage citation or public drunkenness in the first week of school. It reflects poorly on your Chapter and poorly on our community.
